Member Headlight: Shining a Light on Members Cars:

Ron and Gail's Eastman's 1955 Ford F100 Truck



Gail and Ron bought their truck as a work truck back in 1981. It has served its purpose all these years and has become a family favorite. The truck has had four engines, all inline 6-cylinders ranging from 223 cubic inches to just a touch over 300. Four transmissions from manuals to automatics and two rear ends



have all served time in the truck. Brakes, suspension, steering and more have also been improved over the years. Ron and his son's Corey and Peter have made working on this truck a labor of love. Who knows how it might evolve next.

The color is called "Chrome Yellow" but others call it "taxi cab or school bus yellow". The current paint was sprayed on the truck in 1984, painted by Ron in their garage in Anaheim, CA. A classic truck yes, but still a truck and used for hauling whatever needs moving.

The 1950's were perhaps the most nostalgic time for the F-100 pickup, as this type of styling would never be used or seen again but definitely made a lasting impression. The F1 was changed to F100 in 1953. Popular belief is that Ford changed the name after the US Air Force first supersonic fighter jet, the F-100 Super Sabre.

In the 1950's Ford made numerous improvements to the F100 cab, so many it was nicknamed the "Million Dollar Cab" for the amount of money on tooling and research. In 1955 the truck came with a 223 cu in inline



A bit of History:

THE OFFICIAL AUTOMOBILE BLUE BOOK


The 1920 Automobile Blue Book

These days we cannot live without the GPS maps in our cell phones, but we all remember the earlier days of Rand-McNally, AAA Maps and even free gas station maps. During the first few decades of the twentieth century it was even more primitive. Outside of the major American cities, roads were of mostly unpaved and were poorly marked, with improvised signed. It was assumed that locals didn't need road signs, since they already knew their way around the area. Seeing a need for proper road maps and travel advice, several enterprising businessmen created guide books for the early motor car enthusiast. One of the most successful was the *Official Automobile Blue Book* (1901-1929)

The *Blue Book*, as it was commonly known, had a dark blue cover and was only 9" x 4", but it was at least two inches thick! Each *Blue Book* included directions, maps, hotels, places of interest and many, many advertisements. Since there were few reliable road signs, much of driving instructions were arranged by the route—the way a driver experiences touring, for example: “after 2 miles, turn left at the big red barn” or “after 6 miles, the road will fork at a large oak tree—take the right fork”. These directions simply followed the local roads and gave specific notes as needed.

I have a copy of the 1920 Blue Book, Vol. 3, which covers the roads that go through the New York State area. It is in rather poor condition on the outside, but inside it is an amazing collection of old maps, including a large fold-out map of New York State, pages of color ads for towns, hotels, restaurants, automobile services, places of interest, and very specific directions on how to get there. Every few pages

there a small but useful black & white map of a town on the route. And there are some bright single-color and multi-color large ads for destination, roadside attractions, automobile services and automobile products. Quite impressive.





A substantial *little* travel book—including instruction on how to use the Blue book

It is obvious why the *Official Automobile Blue Book* became so popular a hundred years ago. In addition to maps, directions and ads, each Blue Book also gave practical advice on a wide range of topics, including: automobile maintenance, automobile spares to carry on a long road trip, emergency car repairs, outfitting for motor camping; and proper attire for the motorists, and many more related topics.

In a time before there were accurate road maps and reliable travel information was generally unavailable, these Blue Books became an essential guide to motoring around America. These little travel books also greatly benefited local businesses catering to early motorists. One can only imagine how important, and potentially profitable, it was to be favorably listed in such a popular guide book.

The *Official Automobile Blue Book* was printed for nearly three decades and covered several regions of the United States. These books certainly helped to establish the American tradition of the family road trip. My grandfather, on my mother's side, began taking long road trips in the 1920s, and since this book was in the family collection, I would like to think that he used this *Blue Book* to guide him around the New York area in 1920.

whose advice you will find as good as it is timely and whose gift of entertainment, sense of humor and altogether humanly interesting personality you will enjoy to know

Today copies of the *Official Blue Book* can be found at antique stores, automobile swap meets and on eBay (several are currently listed for \$10-200). If

you are interested in early automobile touring or regional history, I highly recommend picking up an *Official Blue Book*. It is fair to say that these little books were as essential to the early motorist as the cell phone is to us today!


