
# Have The Holly-est, Jolly-est Christmas - You Deserve it!

# A bit of History:

# The Memorable 1950s "Curb Feelers" By Fred Weisberger

Once you have seen them (and heard them) you will never forget the popular 1950s accessory, collectively

known as Curb Feelers. When I was a kid, my mother had curb feelers on her 1957 Chevrolet Bel Air. Every time I walked past the car, I would gently kick the curb feeler to hear that unique wobblely sound they made, as they sprung back and forth. And when my mother parallel parked her car too close to a city curb, the curb feelers let out a terrible scraping sound as they dragged on the curb. I will never forget that metallic scraping sound that seemed to emanate from deep within the car itself.

There is not a lot written about this once ubiquitous 1950s automobile accessory. Curb feelers were a practical and simple





accessory. They clearly alerted the driver to curb on the passenger side of the car. Curb feelers helped to protect 50s American cars from "curb rash" damage to their whitewall tires, large hubcaps, rear wheel skirts and the portly low-hung bodies of the period. There were several companies that offered their own version of curb feelers, but they were all basically the same.

By the late 1960s, curb feelers were rarely seen on newer cars. I had nearly forgotten about curb feelers until a few years ago, when I bought a 1950 Packard. The car still had its original curb feelers, just

like I remembered when I was as a kid. And of course, I walked over and gently kicked the curb feeler to hear that old familiar sound again.

Of all of the accessories on post-war cars, perhaps none has a greater impact on small children than curb feelers. They look a lot like "whiskers" on a car, very cute, and they are located near to the ground, just where small kids view cars—and it is fun to play with them!

Today curb feelers add a unique period style to any 50s American car. Curb feelers are inexpensive and widely available, both new manufacture and NOS from accessory dealers and on eBay. If you have them on your antique car, young people will come up to you and ask what are those things? And small children will be inclined to play with them—let

them! Curb Feelers make new memories for the young and remind older folks of the distant past. Lots of fun for everyone...
