





When asked what is your favorite story or adventure you have had with your car? Not a favorite, but definitely an adventure. I was asked to have the car in a music video being produced by someone here in town. The song had a '60s vibe and a convertible Mustang was perfect for a few driving shots they wanted to include in the video. The day of the shoot was one of those blistering hot days we had back in early September. The temperature was well over 100 degrees. We drove out to the old 395 in Bonsall to set things up. As we began shooting videos the car was hard to start. It needed to cool down a bit but it did start up and was running fine, so we began making

passes to be filmed. After some passes, the car just quit on me and was not going to restart no matter how long we let it cool down. I was embarrassed and felt bad for the folks making the video, but they were car guys and took it all in stride. They even took some shots of the car with the hood up on the side of the road to include in the video. I ended up having the car towed back to my house. Of course, it started right up after cooling down back at the house.

Later that evening, they shot some video of the car in front of the Mission Theater. That went off fine, although I was pretty nervous driving it to the theater



thinking it might die on me again. Needless to say, I did some work on the car to keep that from happening again, but I'm not going to try anything fancy with it if the weather gets that hot!

History Bits By Fred Weisberger "Sea to Shining Sea"

Driving Records

The idea of crossing the continent by land has been firmly in the American imagination ever since the Lewis and Clark Expedition of 1804-6. Traveling from the east coast to the west coast retraces the direction of westward expansion of the nation. Going from west to east is, in some ways, like traveling back in time as the buildings and historic sites become older. The distance between the coasts is usually over 2,700 miles, depending on route

driven, and was much farther in the early years. From the early years of the horseless carriage, Americans have successfully driven across the nation. Here are three transcontinental driving records:

The FIRST to make the drive: Dr. Horatio Nelson Jackson (1872-1955) was visiting San Francisco when he decided to prove (and win a \$50 bet) that a horseless carriage could be driven across the country. He bought a slightly used 1903 Winton automobile and hired mechanic Sewall Crocker to assist him. On July 26, 1903, after overcoming countless challenges and spending thousands of dollars, Jackson and Sewall reached New York City with much fanfare after 63 days on the road.

The FIRST WOMAN to drive cross-country: Alice



Huyler Ramsey (1886-1983) was an adventurous 22 year old wife and an exceptionally skilled driver. During an endurance car race, she captured the attention of the Maxwell Briscoe car company. Ramsey was ask if she would be



interested in driving a Maxwell across the country as a publicity stunt. She agreed, but under the conditions that she be the only driver and that the passengers would be only women of her choice. Ramsey drove three other women in a 30 horsepower Maxwell with from New York to San Francisco. On August 7, 1909, after 3,600 miles and 59 days, the four women reached San Francisco.

The FASTEST drive: The secret and illegal speed contest, known as the Cannonball Run, holds the record for the quickest drive across the country. In 2020, drivers Arne Toman, Doug Tabbutt and "spotter" Dunadell Daryoush set the record of 25 hours, 39 minutes from New York City to Santa Monica Pier. The team drove a highly modified 2016 Audi A6, averaging 110 mph (record) and with a top speed of 175 mph.

Exploring America by car is almost a national birthright. You don't have to set a record to enjoy a crosscountry drive. If you have not already experienced it, you might want to add a "Sea to Shinny Sea" drive to your future roadtrip plans.
