
# Fallbrook Skilled Nursing Mini Car Show

#### About this year's poster: Location and Cars Featured

The Main Street Café first opened at this location, 507 South Main, in 2015. The building and its uses go much further back in the history of Fallbrook and auto lore. The corner of Beech and Main, including the adjacent shops, has a long history of being an automotive location as well as several small businesses, some short lived.

The original Main Street Café was at the corner of Clemmens Lane and South Mission (where Walgreens Drugs is today) from 1985 to 1996. After it closed, the name Main Street Cafe became available, and has been used in a couple different places, including where it is today. Let's start at the beginning:

1921: Fred Ash, who lived nearby on Ash St., opened a service station here, soon after Main Ave had been paved and auto traffic increased.

1941-1958: Mahr's Auto Supply & Service Station. Mahr later moved his business to 312 S. Main at the corner of Main & Elder.

1976-1978: Jones Motors, a used car dealership, occupied the entire building.

1984: Wayside Cafe opens.


1995-1996: Wayside Cafe. Carl & Neils Cars & Trucks, a dealership adjacent to Wayside Cafe (same address).

2011-2013: Wayside Cafe. Main Street Motors. a used Car dealership (same address).

2013: Wayside Cafe closed.

2015: Main Street Cafe opens.

In the mid 1950's, Dode Martin rented a part of the building from Mahr's Auto Supply to open his welding shop. Dode, a lifetime Fallbrook resident,



would go on to found Drag Masters with Jim Nelson. Drag Masters built dragsters, raced and sold frames to other racers from 1957 to 1965. They continued to build kit hot rods until 1996. Dode was an early member of the Shafters Car Club. When the curbs were put in on Main, Dode signed the curb in front of the Main Street Café, check it out. Pistons and all!



My introduction to Porsche was in 1955. I was living in Hawaii and had a paper route. A new customer moved into my neighborhood and I began delivering papers to them. They had a brand new 1955 Porsche Continental coupe in Turkish Red. I carpooled to school with their children for a few years and then I lost track of them.

Fast forward to 1971 when I bought my first Porsche, a 1957 Speedster. After going thru a number of Porsches, I located my old neighbors and they still had the 1955 Continental coupe. It had been on blocks since 1972 with 50,000 miles on it and they didn't want to sell. I kept in touch and few years later, I was able to buy it from the widow.

After I retired, we moved from Hawaii to Colorado and then to Fallbrook (my wife found out she didn't like snow). This is a kind of convoluted way of getting to my current Porsche. A friend wanted to buy the 55 and kept after me for years. It had sat unrestored while I restored my 1929 Packard. A year ago he finally made an offer to trade a 1954 Porsche Cabriolet plus cash for my 55 and I made the trade. I had owned a 1955 Porsche Cabriolet before and wanted to get back into an open Porsche.

My plan is to restore the car as soon as I sell my Packard as I don't have the room in my shop for both. The bodywork has already been done and I have all of the parts needed to do the restoration. One of the attractions to this car was the fact that it came with it's original engine, transmission and numbered body panels. The original color was Graphite Metallic, which is golden tan metallic color which is how it will be repainted. I have always enjoyed restoring cars and have done work on Porsches, some Model As, a 1931 Studebaker, a Phantom II Continental Rolls Royce and a 1924 Hispano-Suiza. I prefer to do most of the work myself.

We enjoy the small town feel and friendliness of people in Fallbrook and the private location of our home. As my wife says "The next move is in a box". I have been a member of AACA since the 70s when a group of us in Hawaii got together to form the Aloha Region of AACA, of which I am the sole living founder.

#### **History Bits: FERDINAND PORSCHE**

#### THE GREATEST AUTOMOBILE ENGINEER OF THE 20TH CENTURY

There have been countless engineers who contributed to the development of the automobile. Back in 1999, when many people were reflecting on the advancement of the automobile during the 20th Century, 132 automobile journalists, from 33 countries, were brought together to vote for the "Car Engineer of the Century". This group created a list of outstanding automobile engineers, including some well known names such as: Karl Benz, Ettore Bugatti, Colin Chapman, Rudolf Diesel, Gottlieb Daimler, Henry Ford, Ferdinand Porsche, Frederick Royce, Felix Wankel and several others. The members of the group carefully evaluated the engineering achievements of each man and concluded that Ferdinand Porsche (1875-1951) was the

greatest automobile engineer of the 20th Century.

Ferdinand Porsche's numerous engineering achievements began with designing the very first gasoline-electric hybrid car in 1900, the Lohner-Porsche (photo right). This innovative car also included the first electric hub motor, with one at each wheel, thus also the first 4-wheel drive road car. The car was first exhibited at the 1900 Paris Expedition. Porsche demonstrated and even raced this car.





In 1906, Porsche moved to Austro-Daimler to served as chief design engineer, where he developed several notable race cars, including the successful streamlined "Prince Henry" 85 horsepower race car in 1910. In the 1920s, Porsche did extensive work on supercharging car engines, which culminated in his design of the incomparable 1928-1932 Mercedes-Benz SSK (photo left). The SSK was a dominate sports/race car of the period.

Ferdinand Porsche started his own design consulting firm in 1931 and worked on several innovative design projects. Porsche patented the first torsion bar suspension, which was later used by Volkswagen, Porsche and many other car companies. Another design project later became the successful mid-engine Auto Union race cars of the mid-1930s (photo right). In 1935 Porsche worked with ZF engineering to design and build the first limited-slip differential, which was used on some of the Auto Union race cars.

#### THE GREATEST AUTOMOBILE ENGINEER OF THE 20TH CENTURY

In 1937, Ferdinand Porsche was awarded a German government contract to design the "People's Car", later known as the Volkswagen Beatle (1938-2003). Porsche was inspired by the innovative Tatra car company products, but he greatly improved on the Tatra design to create his own design, the wildly successful Beatle. Eventually, Volkswagen sold over 21 million Beatles—it is the most successful single-platform car in history!

Ferdinand Porsche's last major projects were the Volkswagen-based Kubelwagen (military car, later reissued as the VW "Thing") and Schwimmwagen (amphibious car, photo right).



During his long career, Ferdinand Porsche is credited with many engineering "firsts", including: the first gasoline-electric hybrid, the first electric hub motor, the first 4-wheel drive road car, the first torsion bar suspension, and the first limit-slip differential. Ferdinand Porsche designed many historically important cars during his long career, including the Lohner-Porsche, Mercedes Benz SSK and the Volkswagen Beatle.

Any one of Ferdinand Porsche's major engineering achievements would have made him an important automobile engineer, but the total of his innovative engineering achievements earned him the title of "Car Engineer of the Century".
